

WHAT IS A MASTER GARDENER?



WHAT is a Master Gardener? Do I have to be a gardening expert to take the Master Gardener course? Why would I want to be a Master Gardener? What does a Master Gardener do? These and many other questions come to mind when Master Gardener training is mentioned. Let me try to clarify a few of these points.

A Master Gardener is a person who has a thirst for knowledge about home horticulture, you know, all that stuff growing around your house - the lawn, the shade trees, the shrubs, the garden, the fruit trees, and even your houseplants. It is a person who wants to know things like; which tomato does best in Kansas, what are the best shade trees to plant in a small yard, what kind of fertilizer is best for my fescue, when should I prune my lilac, and how do I get rid of moles that are tunneling throughout my yard.

And things like; how many apple trees do I need for good fruit production, how about peaches and pears, will raspberries do any good here, what can I do to improve the soil in my garden/flower beds/yard, do I need to add lime to my soil, what can I do to control ticks, fleas, and chiggers in my yard. Let's not forget about bagworms. What about herbs, and did I mention crabgrass or dandelions? How many hours of sunshine should you have in your water garden? How much sun does your vegetable garden need?

This is just a small sample of some of the questions that commonly come up in the everyday world of home horticulture. A Master Gardener is not a person who knows all the answers to these questions, but someone who wants to know these answers and wants to learn where to go to find out the answers to other questions just like these.

WHY would anyone want to become a Master Gardener? Well, first to gain the aforementioned knowledge, and second, to share this information with friends, neighbors, and other people in the community. Past classes of Master Gardeners have participated in such projects as the landscaping and planting of the courthouse grounds, conducting a tomato taste test at the Butler County Fair, provided assistance during the Butler County 4-H Fair with the horticulture judging contests and judging of the horticulture exhibits, planting and care of the Kansas Oil Museum Victory Garden, planting and weeding of the Augusta Community Garden Demo Garden and establishment and planting of the Extension Demonstration Garden.

HOW do I become a Master Gardener? By simply filling out an application form at the Extension office (we will even mail it to you) and is available to attend twelve in-person training sessions between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Thursdays from mid-September to mid-December or the online training sessions from 1 to 4 pm on those same dates.

IN EXCHANGE for over 40 hours of comprehensive training in home horticulture you will be asked to give back 40 hours of volunteer service to the horticulture programming efforts of the Butler County Extension office. There is a fee of \$135.00 to cover the cost of the program and educational materials, but what a small price to pay for what you receive. Sessions on landscaping, gardening, fruit and nut production, lawn care, insect and disease control, organic methods, soil management, annuals and perennials, nuisance animals, plant propagation, houseplants, and more are all part of the program.

The KSRE Master Gardener Program is designed to provide the public with sound information in all areas of horticulture.

- Be a Butler County resident or a resident of a nearby county without a Master Gardener Program.
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- Possess a broad interest in horticulture.
- Comply with the policies, rules, and regulations of the Extension Master Gardener Program and the Butler County Extension Council.
- Complete the Basic Master Gardener Training Course either online or in person.
- Complete 40 Hours of volunteer work or advanced education classes as approved by the Horticulture Agent.
- Pay the \$135 fee within one month of acceptance into the program or before the first session of the Master Gardener Basic Training course whichever comes first.

Acceptance into the EMG program is based upon the responses you provide in this application. Please reply to all questions in a complete and informative way but keep your answers brief and concise.

Are you available for basic training? Basic Training is offered on Thursdays from mid-September and can be attended either in person or online. The in-person training starts on September 12th and runs till December 12th from 9 am to 3:30 pm in cooperation with Harvey and Reno counties. The online version is offered via Zoom from September 12th to December 5th from 1 pm to 4 pm and is offered synchronously or asynchronously depending on your schedule. Both training sessions will not meet on October 24th and November 28th. A detailed schedule will be provided upon acceptance into the program. Please describe your time availability and known conflicts for Basic Training. (Please note that we will work with any trainees on conflicts provided you contact the Horticulture Agent)

I wish to become a KSRE/Butler County Extension Master Gardener trainee. I understand that there are two training options, one offered virtually which begins on Thursday, September 12th and meeting every Thursday till December 5th from 1-4 pm (except October 24th and November 28th). This class can be completed synchronously or asynchronously depending on your schedule. There is also an in-person option which begins Thursday, September 12th and meets every Thursday through December 12th, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., with the exception of October 24th and November 28th. Most training sessions will be held in Newton, with field trips to Haysville and Hesston. We will also meet in El Dorado and Hutchinson (For transportation to classes, we usually meet at the Extension Office and ride in the Extension vehicle or you may drive on your own if you prefer.)

I further understand that if I am accepted into the Master Gardener training program, I am entering into a contract to return at least 40 hours of volunteer service to the Horticulture programs of Butler County. I agree to pay the Butler County Extension Office \$135.00 for this course by September 1st.

Master Gardener volunteers may not participate in the KSRE/Butler County Extension Master Gardener Program for personal gain or for commercial recommendations or endorsements. Master Gardeners are expected to provide recommendations based on University research-based information, and to provide educational program assistance in support of the general County Extension education program.

Master Gardeners operate under the direction and recommendation of a trained Extension professional.
